### What is the Tutoring Grant?

School-Led Tutoring is part of the National Tutoring Programme (NTP) in 2021/22. Eligible state-funded schools receive a ring-fenced grant to source their own tutoring provision for disadvantaged and vulnerable pupils who have missed the most education due to COVID-19.

## **Tutoring Grant Report 2021-2022**

#### How has The Priory Primary School spent the Tutoring Grant funding?

During 2021-2022 The Priory Primary School had a total grant budget of £810.01

The school has used funding in the 2021 / 22 year in conjunction with additional funding from the COVID premium grant (carried over from the 2020/21 academic year), the money was used to fund the following:

 X27 1 hour per week sessions for 25 pupils (focusing on Literacy and Numeracy development) for a 12- week block using an NTP sourced Connex Tutor (Total spent = £1323)

- X4 30 min sessions per week for 6 pupils using School-led tutoring for a 12-week block (Total Spent = £320)
- X1 1-hour session per week for 3 pupils using School-led tutoring for a 6-week block (Total Spent = £150)
- X1 20 min session per week for 2 pupils using School-led tutoring for a 39-week block (Total Spent = £356.11)

### **Budget Calculations**

1323 + 320 + 150 + 356.11 = -1339.10

Expenditure from COVID premium = £1339.10

# **Tutoring Grant Action Plan 2022-23**

In total the school will receive £1,134 for School Led Tuition funding/NTP in 22.23. This is government funding and must make up at least 60% of funding spent on tuition for targeted academic support.
