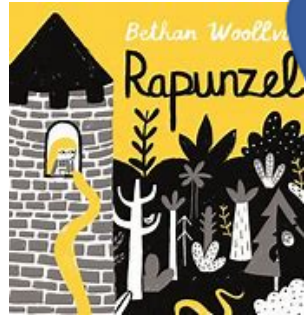

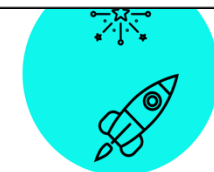
Evaluate & Innovate

Opportunities for Evaluation:

Final writing piece – story writing
Ability to retell a story orally and in their writing using correct story structure/sentence structure.
Understanding and knowledge of Queen Elizabeth and Queen Victoria.

Innovation:

Build a tower for Rapunzel
How could we free Rapunzel from the tower? Build a ladder to free Rapunzel.
Make a crown for King/Queen
Create patterns on a picture frame for a king/queen picture
Create a split pin human body (body parts labelled)



Key Questions / Critical Thinking:

What makes us so special?

- How is Queen Elizabeth the same/different to Queen Victoria?
- What is special about the Queen?
- What would you like to find out about Queen Elizabeth and Queen Victoria?
- What is a question mark?
- What do you already know about the story of Rapunzel?
- What is the repeated phrase in the story of Rapunzel?
- How do we begin a story?
- How are we all special at the same time?
