- What is an online community?



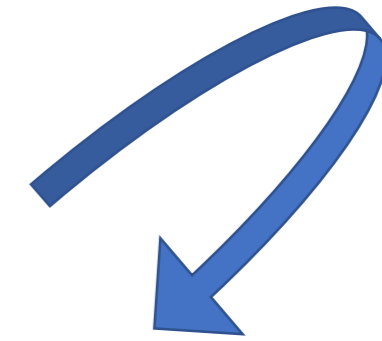
## Evaluate & Innovate
