What is Pupil Premium?

Pupil premium is funding to improve education outcomes for disadvantaged pupils in schools in England. Evidence shows that disadvantaged children generally face additional challenges in reaching their potential at school and often do not perform as well as other pupils.

How has The Priory Primary School spent the Pupil Premium money?

During 2022-2023 The Priory Primary School had a combined budget of £ 10938

The school has used funding in the 2022 / 23 year in a variety of ways including:

- Counselling sessions for specific PP student(s) (Total Spent = £120)
- Subsiding the full cost of Core Text books for PP students (Total Spent = £42)
- Canine Assisted Learning to support emotional welfare of specific PP student(s) (Total Spent = £900)
- ELSA training £120
- ELSA provision £600
- Purchase of Nessy (dyslexia / intervention programme) to specifically support learning Hub students, including PP student(s) (Total Spent = £400)
- Staffing for 1:1 / Small group / ELSA provision for all Pupil Premium students throughout the year including weekly support sessions and adhoc ELSA provision (Total Spent = £8632)
- Additional School-led and government funded (NTP) tutoring for specific PP children (Total Spent = N/A – this funding was attributed to the COVID recovery and Tutoring Grant funding)
- School trips for PP pupils £124
- PGL residential covered for 3 students £1500 (but covered through sports premium)
